Today the <u>Planning Commission of the City of San Antonio</u> is considering approval for another development on the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone with known habitat of endangered karst invertebrates and golden cheeked warblers. For years the City has approved too many developments that flagrantly violate the Endangered Species Act, causing trouble for those landowners, like <u>Camp Bullis</u>, who actually do comply with the law.
