


Dear GEAA members and friends,

This is the point in the 83rd Legislative Session when your voice will make all the difference in the world. During the next few weeks, bills good and bad will be scheduled for votes in the House and the Senate.

<u>H.B. 824 - Callegari</u> - a bill that would exempt sewage spills under 1,000 gallons from the current requirement that all spills be reported to TCEQ - is scheduled for a vote in the House of Representatives on April 30th.

Please let <u>your representative</u> know that <u>you oppose this bill</u>. In order to address persistent problems before they become big problems, TCEQ needs to be made aware of all sewage spills. <u>GEAA's</u> recently released <u>studies on sewage spills</u> within the Hill Country would have painted a completely different picture of the condition of our sewage infrastructure had the reporting requirements proposed by HB 824 been in effect. We can't let the Legislature just sweep problems with wastewater infrastructure under the rug.
